Course Description This course will focus on the foundational elements of beginning a business in the e-Commerce domain of the World Wide Web. Students will be exposed to the principles needed to conceptualize and design a sound business approach and will learn the technologies, software, and platforms necessary to initiate their business model.

Workshops and activities build to larger more advanced projects where the students have the opportunity to activate the learned skills.
